MOAA and USNI Host Fifth Annual Defense Forum:

"The Journey Back: A National Commitment to Helping Wounded Warriors & Families Transition"

Alexandria, Va., (Sept. 15, 2011) — The Military Officers Association (MOAA) and U.S. Naval Institute (USNI) will present the fifth annual Defense Forum Washington, Monday, Sept. 26, at the Ronald Reagan Building and International Trade Center in Washington, D.C. The forum will focus on the challenges and opportunities facing our separating troops, including guard members and reservists as they transition from military service and reintegrate back home and into a civilian workplace.

The program, titled "The Journey Back: A National Commitment to Helping Wounded Warriors and Families Transition," will expand on groundbreaking exchanges in the four previous defense forums about issues affecting the physical and psychological care and well-being of our force, wounded warriors, and veterans and their families.

This year's program will feature five distinguished speakers, including Army Vice Chief of Staff Gen. Peter Chiarelli and Beth Chiarelli, plus two discussion panels focusing on issues of readjustment in the home, the community, and in the workplace.

Panel topics are:

- "Community Reintegration The Challenges Back Home," with moderator Kathleen Troia "KT" McFarland, National Security Analyst and Host of DEFCON 3, FOX News, and
- "Deployment to Employment Are We Really Committed to Hiring Wounded Warriors?" with moderator Barbara Starr, Pentagon Correspondent, CNN.

Questions from the audience will be welcomed. Speakers, panelists, and leaders of MOAA and USNI will be available for interviews.

The forum, including lunch, is free to active duty and reserve component servicemembers. Registration is \$45 for other USNI-MOAA members and their spouses, \$75 for non-members, and \$25 for students.
