Preparations on board the destroyer *Eaton* (DDE-510) for support of a planned invasion at the Bay of Pigs in April 1961, 3-8; support role of commercial ships, 4-8, 10-11, 26-27; invasion on 17 April, 8-11; planned air support by U.S. aircraft was not permitted, 9-10, 22-23; rescue of survivors who made their way offshore, 11-12; the *Eaton* sent two officers ashore in a boat to rescue Cuban survivors, 12-17; the *Eaton* was bracketed by gunfire from shore when she entered the Bay of Pigs at night, 18-19; relationship between the Bay of Pigs invasion of 1961 and the Cuban Missile Crisis of 1962, 24-25; political aspects of the operation, 25-26; souvenirs of, 28-29

Castro, Fidel

Cuban prime minister during the ill-fated Bay of Pigs invasion in April 1961, 11, 14, 25, 26

Central Intelligence Agency

Agent Grayston Lynch took part in the ill-fated Bay of Pigs invasion in April 1961, 7, 12, 14-15, 18; a suspected agent was taken aboard the destroyer *Eaton* (DDE-510) in a straitjacket, 17; CIA men were reported to have blown up a refinery at Santiago, Cuba, as part of the operation, 21

Classified Information

Following the ill-fated Bay of Pigs invasion in April 1961, the commodore of Destroyer Division 282 told the crewmen of the destroyer *Eaton* (DDE-510) not to discuss what they had just seen, 20

Commercial Ships

Ships loaded with Cuban troops participated in the ill-fated invasion of the Bay of Pigs, Cuba, in April 1961, 4-8, 10-11, 26-27

Crutchfield, Captain Robert R., USN

Served as commodore of Destroyer Division 282 during the Bay of Pigs invasion in April 1961, 3-7, 9-10, 12-13, 17, 19-21, 27-28

Cuban Missile Crisis

Relationship between the Bay of Pigs invasion of 1961 and the Cuban Missile Crisis of 1962, 24-25

Eaton, USS (DDE-510)

Antisubmarine training exercises in the early 1960s, 2-3; preparations for participation in the Bay of Pigs invasion in April 1961, 3-7; operated in range of merchant ships while approaching Cuba, 4-8; surgery performed in the wardroom on Cubans who had been accidentally shot, 5-6; operations off the coast of Cuba during the invasion, 8-12; dispatched Smoot and another junior officer to go ashore in Cuba to rescue Cuban survivors, 12-17; came under fire while in the Bay of Pigs at night, 18-19; the commodore of Destroyer Division 282 told the ship's crewmen that what they had just seen was classified and should not be discussed, 20; reaction of the crew when the invasion failed, 23-24

Essex, USS (CVS-9)

Operated in support of the Bay of Pigs invasion in April 1961, 8

Guatemala

Role in support of the ill-fated Bay of Pigs invasion in April 1961, 5, 7-9, 21, 23

Kauffman, Lieutenant (j.g.) Richard, USN

While serving in the destroyer *Eaton* (DDE-510) during the Bay of Pigs invasion in April 1961, was detailed to go ashore in Cuba and look for Cuban survivors from the invasion, 12-17, 28-29

Lynch, Grayston

CIA agent who took part in the ill-fated Bay of Pigs invasion in April 1961, 7, 12, 14-15, 18

Medical Problems

Surgery was performed in the wardroom of the destroyer *Eaton* (DDE-510) on Cubans who had been accidentally shot while practicing for the planned invasion of the Bay of Pigs, Cuba in April 1961, 5-6, 26

Murray, USS (DDE-576)

Operated in support of the Bay of Pigs invasion in April 1961, 2, 8, 10-12, 20

Perkins, Commander Peter R., USN (USNA, 1945)

Served as commanding officer of the destroyer *Eaton* (DDE-510) during the Bay of Pigs invasion in April 1961, 3, 5, 19-20

Rescue on Land

The destroyer *Eaton* (DDE-510) sent two officers ashore in a boat to rescue Cuban survivors of the ill-fated Bay of Pigs invasion in April 1961, 12-17
