USS Duluth: Price given command during shake down cruise, p. 361; ship sent to Australia for 25th anniversary of Coral Sea Battle, p. 363-4; Subic and the Java Sea - and then becomes a unit of the Ready Group ALPHA, p. 370; participates in seven

amphibious landings in I Corps and II Corps areas,  
p. 371-2; p. 387 ff;

USS ENTERPRISE: her absence from her pier at time of  
Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor saved her,  
p. 68;

FLT AIR WING I: Price transfers from old VP-14 to Com Fit.  
Air Wing I, p. 69-70;

FLIGHT TRAINING: p. 75-7; Price gets his wings in Nov. 1944, p.  
85; a temporary commission as an ensign, p. 85-6;

USS KITTY HAWK: the fire and the problems it presented to BuPers over the assigned personnel, p. 277-8;

LAKEHURST, New Jersey: impressions of the lighter-than-air base on Price, p. 7-9;

LIBERATORS: (PB 2-Y-2): VP - 14 gets new planes, p. 69;

MOORER, Admiral Thomas H.: secured twenty OV-10A helicopters from the marines for the River Patrol Force, p. 500; p. 506;

MONTEREY MANAGEMENT SCHOOL: Price ordered there from the USS ASHLAND, p. 341; p. 349-50;

MONTEREY NAVAL SCHOOL: Price reports (Feb. 1950), p. 133; four quarters of electrical engineering, p. 134 ff;

NAVAL AIR TECHNICAL TRAINING CENTER - Jacksonville, FL, p. 201; p. 204; training to handle the SPARROW I missile, p. 204-5;

NAVAL AVIATION: see entries under: VP-14; USS WRIGHT: with outbreak of war the navy changed some policies - including requirements for flight school, p. 59;

NAVAL RESERVES: Price's reaction to the men on training cruises, p. 264-6;

NAV SUR PAC: (Navy Surface Force): formed by Salzer in 1975 from elements of the decommissioned Amphibious Force, the Cruiser-Destroyer Force and the Service Force, p. 633; p. 636; Price becomes Inspector General, p. 636;

U. S. NAVY: Price enlists in Navy (Sept. 1939), p. 13; great desire to attend the Naval Academy, p. 14-15; fails attempt at Academy exams - navy sends him to aviation metalsmith's school in Pensacola, p. 20; p. 26-8; the Receiving Station in San Diego, p. 30-31; a reorganization of TF-3 in 1968 for pursuit of common objectives, p. 432-4;

USS NORTON SOUND: her use in demonstrating the TERRIOR Missile, p. 224-5;

USS PAUL REVERE: Price's flagship in 1974 while in Vietnam area, p. 628; p. 629-30; p. 631;

PEARL HARBOR: The Japanese attack on December 7, 1941 as told by Price who was attached to VP-14, p. 47-57;

PHIB PAC: Price goes from Monterey school to Phib Pac as war plans and contingency officer, p. 352; later becomes force operations officer, p. 353-4; a big amphibious exercise - SILVER LANCE, p. 358-9; difficulties with communications, p. 360-1;

PHIB RON 11: Price takes command in July 1970, p. 521 ff; the complexion of this group, p. 524; orders for decommissioning of #11 with winding down of the Vietnam War, p. 526; loading tanks for the marines at Okinawa, p. 527-9; Squadron decommissioned in Long Beach on March 30, 1971, p. 533; p. 540-1; Price describes problems of loading at Danang, p. 546-7;

POINT MUGU: missile testing site - Price elects to go there after special course in Jacksonville, Florida, p. 210 ff; assigned to the Naval Air Station at Mugu, p. 217; use of drones in testing missiles, p. 221-2; the test of a TERRIER missile for the benefit of Admiral Sharp, CincPac, p. 224-8;

PRICE, RADM Arthur W. SEAL Teams: use in Vietnam, p. 410; p. 447; p. 473;

SEALORDS (SE Asia Lake-Ocean-River and Delta Strategy) - p. 434; Salzer becomes commander, p. 435; four barrier patrols established, p. 436-7; p. 474; p. 489; p. 495;

SHILLATO, Barry: Deputy for Logistics in DOD, p. 586;

SIDEWINDER: p. 206-7; a demonstration at Point Mugu for Admiral Burke, p. 219-21;

SPARROW MISSILE: See *NAVAirTech. Training School*;

STEELE, VADM George Peabody II: Com 7th Fleet, p. 609; p. 629; p. 633;

USS STRIBLING: Price ordered as Exec (1956), p. 242 ff; establishing authority, p. 247-8; qualifies for command, p. 249-50; takes over from skipper on emergency leave - for an exercise, June 1957, p. 250 ff; Price detached after 18 months to command the LIDDLE (APD-60), p. 255; more on the

STRIBLING, p. 256-7;

TERRIOR Missile: a special demonstration for CincPacFlt - off Hawaii - using the NORTON SOUND, p. 224;

THOMPSON, Sir Robert: British guerrilla-type warfare specialist in Vietnam for consultations, p. 593-5;

VBF-75: Price assigned to squadron in Atlantic, p. 115 ff; then back to night fighter squadron, p. 122;

VCN-2: Price joins squadron at Key West (Dec. 1946), p. 122;

VETH, RADM Kenneth L.: relieved by Adm. Zumwalt as Comdr. Naval Forces, Vietnam, p. 432; p. 465; Price comments on Adm. Veth, p. 483-5; p. 488; p. 490;

VIETNAM - COM NAV FOR: Salzer named as Commander (1971) - asks Price to be his deputy, p. 534-5; Price has cognizance of operations and intelligence, p. 551-2; Price visits every U. S. base in Vietnam as a start, p. 553; transfers of U. S. ships to the Vietnamese Navy, p. 553-6; Seabees erect radar installations along the coast to aid in detection of sampan ammo runners, p. 560 ff;

WAKE ISLAND: USS WRIGHT establishes a seaplane base at Wake (Dec. 1940), p. 39-43;

WAVES: detailing WAVES, p. 291-2;

WEISNER, Admiral Maurice Franklin: Price talks with him on inspection trip to Vietnam, p. 621;

WESTMORELAND, General Wm.: p. 490-1;

USS WRIGHT (Seaplane tender - AV-1): Price assigned to her at Pearl Harbor, p. 34 ff; makes third class rank, p. 38; servicing seaplanes at Palmyra, Wake, etc., p. 39 ff; Price transferred to VP-14 at Kaneohe, p. 44 ff;

ZUMWALT, Admiral Elmo: assumes command (Sept. 1968) the Naval Forces, Vietnam, p. 432. Begins the Vietnamization program in the fall of 1968, p. 456-7; decided to make Ben Luc a permanent base for the Vietnamese Navy, p. 469; p. 534-5; p. 568; p. 620-1;
