Served on board the destroyer *Ludlow* (DD-438) during the Allied invasion of North Africa in November 1942, 18-19

## Camp Robert Smalls, Great Lakes, Illinois

Site of recruit training for black sailors in World War II, 3-17 In 1944 the Navy's first black officers were trained at Great Lakes, 17-33

#### Chicago, Illinois

Site of liberty for black sailors undergoing recruit training in World War II, 13

## Dille, Lieutenant (junior grade) John F., USNR

Was involved in training black recruits at the Great Lakes Naval Training Station during World War II, 3-4, 9-11, 14-15, 19, 29, 31

# **Disciplinary Problems**

Misguided attempt to punish black sailors at the Great Lakes Naval Training Station during World War II, 20-22

#### **Enlisted Personnel**

Recruit training at Great Lakes, Illinois, during World War II, 2-17, 28

## Goodwin, Reginald E.

Member of the Golden Thirteen, the first black naval officers, trained at Great Lakes Naval Training Station in 1944, 14, 30

#### **Great Lakes, Illinois, Naval Training Station**

Training of recruits during World War II, 2-17

In 1944 the Navy's first black officers were trained at Great Lakes, 17-33

Near the end of World War II V-7 aviation program dropouts were trained at Great Lakes, 28

After they were commissioned, the first black officers were not welcome at the base officers' club, 31

#### Kauffold, Ensign Vance A., USNR

Was involved in training black recruits at the Great Lakes Naval Training Station during World War II, 3-4, 11-12

## Lear, Charles B.

Member of the Golden Thirteen, the first black naval officers, trained at Great Lakes Naval Training Station in 1944, 29-30

#### **Leave and Liberty**

Liberty in Chicago for black sailors undergoing recruit training in World War II, 13

#### Louis, Joe

Black boxing champion who was at a club in Chicago during World War II, 13

## Martin, Graham E.

Member of the Golden Thirteen, the first black naval officers, trained at Great Lakes Naval Training Station in 1944, 7, 20-24, 30

## Nelson, Dennis D. II

Member of the Golden Thirteen, the first black naval officers, trained at Great Lakes Naval Training Station in 1944, 21

#### Racial Issues

Segregated training for black sailors at Great Lakes Naval Training Station in World War II, 3-16

In 1943 Richmond was discouraged from sending an article to the *Naval Institute Proceedings* on the progress of black sailors in the Navy, 16-17

In 1944 the Navy's first black officers were trained at Great Lakes, 17-29

After they were commissioned, the first black officers were not welcome at the base officers' club, 31

## Richmond, Lieutenant Paul D., USNR (USNA, 1942)

Boyhood in the Midwest, 1-2

Naval Academy midshipman, 1938-41, 1-2, 18, 24

Assigned to the Great Lakes Naval Training Station, 1942-44, 1-33

#### Roosevelt, President Franklin D.

Visited the Great Lakes Naval Training Station in 1944, 5, 16

#### **Shore Patrol**

In Chicago for black sailors on liberty in World War II, 13

#### **Training**

Recruit training at Great Lakes, Illinois, during World War II, 2-17, 28 In 1944 the Navy's first black officers were trained at Great Lakes, 17-33

# Tunney, Lieutenant Commander James J. "Gene," USNR

In charge of physical training for the Navy during World War II, 9-10

# Turek, Commander William, USNR (USNA, 1926)

During World War II commanded the recruit training organization at the Great Lakes Naval Training Station, 28

## Van Ness, Lieutenant (junior grade) Donald O., USNR (USNA, 1935)

Was involved in training black recruits at the Great Lakes Naval Training Station during World War II, 3-4, 11-12, 17

## White, William Sylvester

Member of the Golden Thirteen, the first black naval officers, trained at Great Lakes Naval Training Station in 1944, 22-23
